Holy Week



Our Gospel reading for Palm Sunday, is from St Mark 14:1 to 15-47. The story of Jesus' death is in all four Gospels, with some small differences. Perhaps you might read the different accounts over Easter week? Mark's account is the earliest, but did you notice that the sons of Simon of Cyrene, who was made help Jesus carry the cross are mentioned? Scholars think that Alexander and Rufus may have been eyewitnesses, who became believers and helped contribute to

Mark's Gospel. Perhaps some of the women mentioned did too. Palm Sunday starts in triumph for Jesus, (Mark Ch 11), as he enters Jerusalem, with people cheering him on, only for it to end initially, in disaster as he is betrayed by his apostle Judas, is arrested, tortured, and killed, crying out as he is suffering on the cross. In every society there can be a

group or mob, who can turn on a person, a soccer manager, or a politician. It is tempting to keep our head down when people are attacking someone, even verbally, but we are called to speak the truth and not follow the mob, or society's groupthink. The story of our Gospel finally ends in triumph again, with the resurrection of Jesus, the darkness has not overcome the light. Like his disciples who were devastated at his death, but experienced his presence again, and had regained meaning and purpose in their lives, so we too, can overcome our challenges in life, if we can remain strong in faith in our loving God and Jesus the Son who is our light!
