Our Gospel reading is from Luke 3:1-6

A voice cries out in the wilderness- prepare a place for the Lord.

Luke commences the Gospel story of John the Baptist, using the name of the Roman Emperor Tiberius and other rulers to locate him in time and place. By means of these names and seemingly important people, Luke is saying that something of world significance happened in that year in a backwater of the Roman Empire, unknown to the civil and religious leaders of the day. Because of what happened over the next thirty-three years, we are gathered here today.

Jesus was a carpenter, in Greek a tektōn, meaning a builder's labourer. Who this Jesus became, what he said and did, and his final destiny changed the face of world history.

In the coming weeks can we prepare a place for the Lord in our hearts and minds?



Today 8th December is also the Feast of the IMMACULATE CONCEPTION

This is a Catholic teaching (dogma) asserting that Mary, the mother of Jesus, was preserved free from the effects of the sin of Adam (usually referred to as "original sin") from the first instant of her conception. Her conception to her mother traditionally known as St Ann, is separate to the virgin birth of Jesus (which can confuse many still). John Duns Scotus, a Franciscan (1266-1303) argued that Christ's redemptive grace had already applied to Mary to prevent sin from reaching her soul. Gradual acceptance of this over the next several centuries led finally to December 8, 1854, that Pius IX, urged by the majority of Catho-

lic bishops throughout the world, that the doctrine was revealed by God and to be believed by all Catholics. *Reflection by Deacon*
