Our Gospel reading is from John 6: 60-69.

Jesus said, "do you wish to go away"...Simon Peter answered..."Lord to whom shall we go? you have the words of eternal life". Our Gospel reading is from the end of John Ch 6. Historically we know that John's Gospel was the last of the four to be written, and the early Christian community may have been arguing about aspects of their faith, as we still do today. John's Gospel is speaking to all of us who struggle in our faith journey. Looking back on Jesus' ministry and the eyewitness accounts of what happened, the Gospel highlights this story.

Many of those listening to Jesus could not accept or understand his message that he was the 'living bread come down from heaven' and that 'anyone who eats this bread will live for ever.' Some then left him and lost faith, but others who struggled to understand stayed. Simon Peter who was to become the leader, stated that there was no turning back for him, he believed that Jesus had the message of eternal life.

What do the words of Peter mean for you? "Lord...you are the Holy One of God."



The season starts on 1 September, the World Day of Prayer for Creation, and ends 4 October, the Feast of St. Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology beloved by many Christian denominations.
