Gospel reading 2nd March 2025. Sunday 8 C: Luke Chapter 6

A good person draws what is good from the store of goodness in his heart...

Our Gospel reading from Luke ends Jesus' sermon on the plain which we have heard over the last few weeks. Luke who has a particular focus on Jesus' care for the needs of the poor, and vulnerable, challenges us to reflect on what our real intentions are when we interact with others. What lies deep within our hearts when we speak to others, are we being authentic and acting with integrity?

Luke shares two of Jesus' warnings, expressed in colourful language and with exaggeration and wit which is characteristic of Jesus' teachings. The first of the eyes with the splinter and the log, warns us to use the same standards in judging ourselves as we use in judging others. The second parable of the good and bad tree invites us to examine our motivation for what we do.

If we can all be motivated by love, then we shall bear good fruit.






